MCHS Parent Survey:

- 98.61% of parents are satisfied with the opportunities their children have to see faith in action at our school.
- 2. 94.6% of parents are satisfied with the opportunity their children have to participate in citizenship building events such as social justice projects, community service projects and fundraising to assist others.
