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MCHS is an excellent school and we are committed to continue to improve. The following is a brief historical update of what has taken place to this time. ## **Open House - March 10**

We are not sure exactly how many people attended the event on this particular evening, but it was a sizeable number. In keeping with the past two open house events, we incorporated colleges, universities and a few recruiters to our evening. This has been done to align what happens in high school to what is possible once they graduate. If the post-secondary institutions are there, parents and students can see what is required for the different programs and begin to program appropriately.

This year we also scheduled two sessions about high school programing 9-12, to better assist parents in understanding course progression and requirements.

# 2016/2017 Student Timetable Update

Work realistically began at the start of this school year, initially with looking at what was working so far this year and what challenges we were experiencing. One of the challenges is determining how many blocks of different classes are needed (i.e. English 30-1 and English 30-2) and when they can be offered to create as few conflicts with student requests as possible.

This year we have started the registration process earlier than in previous years and all current students, grades 9-11 have received packages. GHP and Legal students have also been visited at their schools and packages given, along with information on what is possible.

So far the return rate of registration packages is significantly better than last year at the same point in time.

One factor that we need to continue to accommodate is to increase the number of students taking English 30-1 and 30-2 in semester 1, making them eligible to register in the NorQuest ENGL 1011 in semester 2 if they so decide
